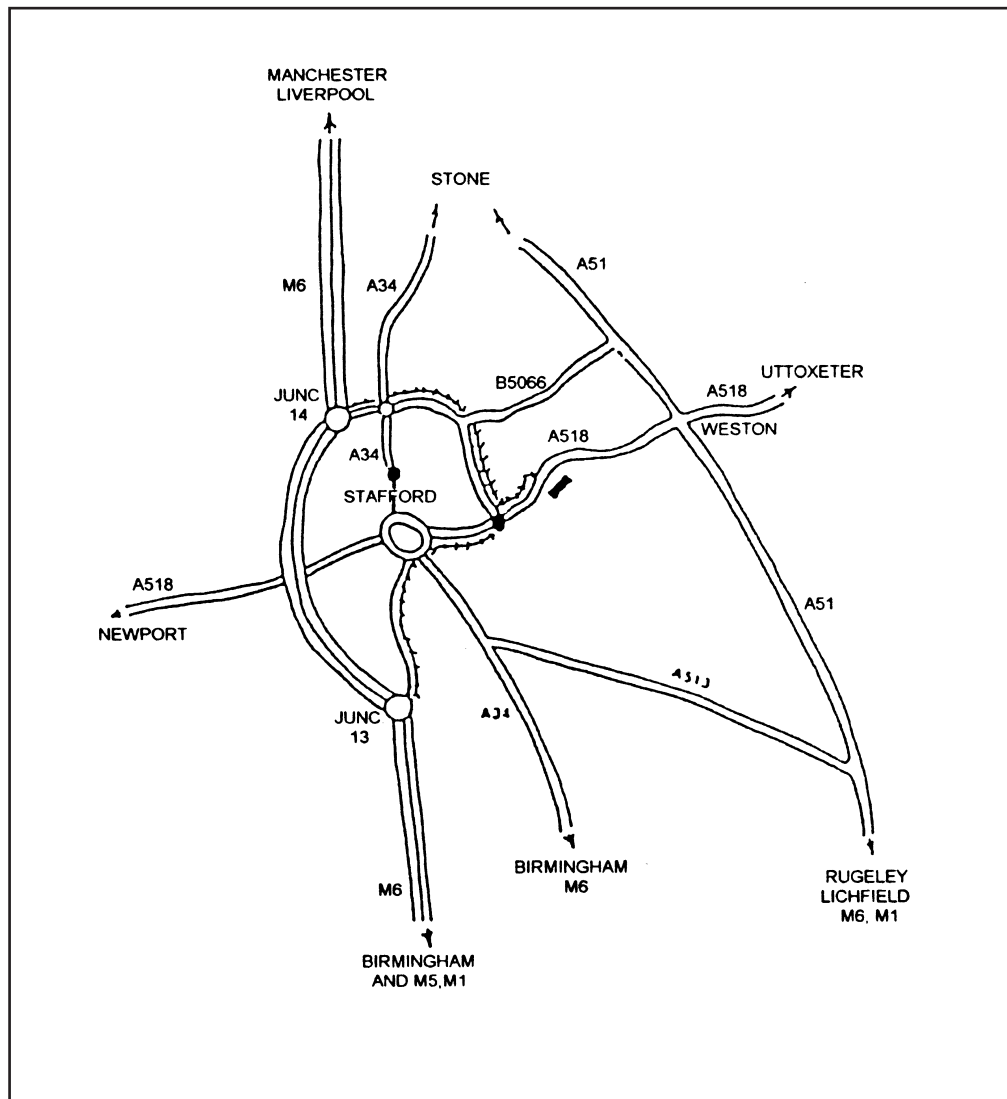

Miss Rita Monkhouse "Cabaret" Special Beginners Class - Dog

Miss Rita Monkhouse was probably the most successful exhibitor and breeder of the pre-second world war era. Her kennel affix of "Cabaret" was synonymous with such famous Dalmatian names as Ch. Cabaret Croftycock and Ch. Cabaret Copyright who helped shape the Dalmatian breed as we know it, both winning consistently at the highest level. She joined the North of England Dalmatian Club in 1926 and almost immediately placed a proposition before the AGM that a "Special cup" be offered for competition at the Liverpool show, to be won by Livers only. Miss Monkhouse judged extensively in the U.K. and also in America where she judged the famous "Morris & Essex" show. She was elected onto the Committee of our Club in 1946 and elevated to the position of Chairman in 1961 which she held until 1974 when she was made President of the club. Rita Monkhouse was also the editor of the British Dalmatian Club newsletter for 12 years and was also a Vice President and District Rep. for that club. Miss Monkhouse died suddenly in 1975 but left a legacy of sound breeding that can be traced through to many of today's lines.

Mrs Monica M. Davidson "Konavlje" Special Beginners Class - Bitch

Monica was born in Manchester in 1922 and trained as a cartographic draftsman on leaving school. When war broke out she enlisted in the WRAF becoming a Corporal. She was stationed at Marlowe and was a keen swimmer and rower. One of her feats was to dive from the bridge into the River Thames! She met and married Gordon Davidson and when the war was over they enjoyed travelling around Italy and Yugoslavia. The prefix Konavlje was the name of a valley in Yugoslavia famed for its beautiful women.

Their first dog was a Chow cross called Laddie who used to accompany them when they went hiking and cycling. Eventually they decided on a pedigree and the first Dalmatian arrived, a dog with the grand name of Creskeld Magnificent Michael. Monica later bought a liver spotted bitch from Dr & Mrs Piper, Greenmount Golden Glow. The first Konavlje Champion was K. Miss Georgeous owned and campaigned by Susan Gatheral and Monica won 2 CCs with her brother K Golden Jester. Ch Highstables Countess of K bred by Carol Pedlow and owned by Monica was to become the foundation for her many Champions.....Miss Fabulous, Creme de la Creme, Bella Figlia, K Rather Special at Luccombe, K Donna at Dalesbred, K The Wayfarer at Miragua and K Cara Nome at Kintegus.

She was a founder member of The Dalmatian Club of Scotland and served on the committee of The NEDC for many years. Passionate about the breed she took great pleasure from the many friendships her beloved Dalmatians brought her.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **5th June 2010**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

Withdrawal - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

Transfer - If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy, Puppy and Junior excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

SPECIAL JUNIOR VETERAN	For dogs over seven years, but under ten years of age on the first day of the Show.
SPECIAL VETERAN	For dogs over ten years of age on the first day of the Show.
MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
YEARLING	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months on the first day of the Show.
MAIDEN	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
SPECIAL BEGINNERS PROGENY	For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate. For a dog or bitch, accompanied by at least three of its registered progeny. The dog or bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.
BRACE	For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.
NOT FOR COMPETITION	Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed. Only puppies of six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition, however puppies of four months and over are accepted NFC but must be KC Registered and included on the entry form.

Mrs Ilex E. Whiting (Cragvallie)

Having grown up with horses my obvious choice of dog was the Dalmatian. I've now owned and bred over 30 years, first showing in 1976. I'd previously tried obedience but my Dal dog got bored with repeated exercises much preferring to escort my horse as a "road dog".

To date I have made up 3 Dalmatian champions, one home bred, another a Group winner and had 2 others on 2 CC's each. Of the 14 Dals I've shown all except 4 attained a stud book entry, many home bred from the 10 litters I have had.

I served on the NOEDC committee in the early 1980's and again in the 1990's and helped produce the first ever NOEDC handbook. I first judged the breed in 1981 and awarded CC's at Bath in 1993, DC of S 1998, City of Birmingham 2003, NIDC 2005 and Paignton 2007 where my BOB went onto BIS.

I also award CC's in Smooth Vizlas, my other love, which I've shown since 1986, making up a Show Champion who also worked occasionally. I am currently campaigning two imported Wire Vizlas with some success. I've also shown Dobes, a Longhaired Dach, a Boston and Basset Fauve, the latter two with stud book entries.

It is a privilege to be asked to adjudicate at the oldest Dalmatian clubs show, and am really looking forward to my appointment.

Mr L. M. Cutts (Marzelina)

Heide and I first became interested in Dalmatians in 1964, when we bought two litter brothers and we started to show them at local Open shows in 1966. Unfortunately, towards the end of that year, there was a widespread breakdown in the most common canine vaccine at the time and we lost both dogs to hard pad-distemper.

After a short break to allow all trace of the virus to disappear from our home, in 1967 we bought our first real show dog, called Rufus, who became our first Champion in 1970. We were fortunate to be able to call on the experience of Mrs Pat McClellan (the founder of the Washakie line) in choosing him and I am pleased to acknowledge how much we learnt from her during our early years in the breed.

Since then we have never been without at least one Dalmatian. In all, we have made up six champions, two of which were home-bred. I first awarded CCs in 1980 and, among other shows, I have since judged our breed at Crufts and at four breed Championship Shows.

I am intensely proud of my long association with the North of England Dalmatian Club, having held four different Offices in the club over the years, and I am now an Honorary Life Member, thanks to the generosity of the members. I am looking forward very much to judging at the forthcoming Club Championship Show and wish all exhibitors a very enjoyable day.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

DOGS MUST NOT BE LEFT IN CARS

The Car Park is patrolled and in accordance with the guidelines recommended by The Kennel Club, remedial action will be taken in the event of any dogs found to be in a distressed condition.

Regulations For The Preparation of Dogs For Exhibition F (Annex B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Dog Fouling F8(a): Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at a Kennel Club licensed Show within the licensed venue and environs of that event including the car and caravan parks and approaches. The Society will arrange for the dispersal of suitable receptacles to assist compliance with Regulation F8(a).

Attraction of Exhibits F(1) 17f.: The attracting of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited. It is the duty of the Judge, Steward or Show Management noticing such attraction to ask that it cease.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The show will open at 9.30 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- Entry fees: 1st Entry £18 per dog. £3.00 for subsequent entries with same dog. Not For Competition £4.50. Catalogues £3.00 (limited number on the day at £3.50). Membership fees : £9.00 single plus £4.50 for each additional joint, family or partnership member. Entries may be made online at www.dog.biz.
- There is no prize money is on offer at this show.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Proviso. For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- Best in Show.** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Proviso. For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement(s) in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade — take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
- Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- Exhibitors with children must ensure that they are kept under control at all times and will be held personally responsible for any damage caused by them whilst in the showground.
- Please ensure your dog is kept on a lead and under control at all times, even whilst in the exercise area.
- The committee of this Show cannot be held responsible for products advertised or sold by stand holders at this Show, and remind exhibitors that such products may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of dogs for Exhibition.

The following Awards are offered:

Best Breeder in Breed

Best Breeder Group in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th

Grand Final at Crufts 2010

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Twenty points are required to qualify for Finals at Crufts in the following year.

Points are cumulative over a calendar year and are gained as follows:

Breed win	1 point
Fourth in Group	1 point
Third in Group	2 points
Second in Group	3 points
First in Group	4 points

Breeders gaining 20 points should apply to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club to apply for the Crufts Final. After amassing 20 points a breeder cannot enter any further Best Breeder Competitions for that calendar year.
