

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

FROM M1 (Southbound) (Approximately 6 minutes)

Leave at Junction 30 on A616 (Newark/Chesterfield).

At next roundabout take A619 (Chesterfield).

In approximately 3 miles, enter Staveley, over pedestrian crossing, over Railway Bridge to Roundabout. Turn left at the Roundabout.

After 200 yards, turn left at the traffic lights by the Sports centre, signposted Inkersall, Poolsbrook and Speedwell Rooms.

Venue on the right after 200 yards. Car Park is just past the building.

FROM M1 (Northbound)

Leave at Junction 29A exit signposted A6192/Bolsover/A632.

At 1st Roundabout take 3rd exit onto Erin Road.

At 2nd Roundabout continue on Erin Road signed STAVELEY (A6129) - keep on this road.

After Poolsbrook Country Park (on the left) take 2nd exit on left to Cemetery Road.

At end of Cemetery Road turn right and venue is 200 yards on the left.

The exercise area is in the Car Park, PLEASE DO NOT use the Football pitch and recreation area. PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG, bucket, shovels and bags are provided.

South Yorkshire Whippet Club General Code of Ethics

All members of the South Yorkshire Whippet Club undertake to abide by its general Code of Ethics.

Club members:

- 1 Will properly house, feed, water and exercise all dogs under their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention if and when required.
- 2 Will agree without reservation that any veterinary surgeon performing an operation on any of their dogs which alters the natural conformation of the animal, or carries out a caesarian section on a bitch, may report such operation to the Kennel Club.
- 3 Will agree that no healthy puppy will be culled. Puppies which may not conform to the Breed Standard should be placed in suitable homes.
- 4 Will abide by all aspects of the Animal Welfare Act.
- 5 Will not create demand for, nor supply, puppies that have been docked illegally.
- 6 Will agree not to breed from a dog or bitch which could be in any way harmful to the dog or to the breed.
- 7 Will not allow any of their dogs to roam at large or to cause a nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out official duties.
- 8 Will ensure that their dogs wear properly tagged collars and will be kept leashed or under effective control when away from home.
- 9 Will clean up after their dogs in public places or anywhere their dogs are being exhibited.
- 10 Will only sell dogs where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy and healthy life and will help with the re-homing of a dog if the initial circumstances change.
- 11 Will supply written details of all dietary requirements and give guidance concerning responsible ownership when placing dogs in a new home.
- 12 Will ensure that all relevant Kennel Club documents are provided to the new owner when selling or transferring a dog, and will agree, in writing, to forward any relevant documents at the earliest opportunity, if not immediately available.
- 13 Will not sell any dog to commercial dog wholesalers, retail pet dealers or directly or indirectly allow dogs to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind. Will not sell by sale or auction Kennel Club registration certificates as stand alone items (not accompanying a dog).
- 14 Will not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed nor falsely advertise dogs nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of a dog.
- 15 Members will, when breeding dogs, adopt as a minimum standard the principles, requirements and recommendations as embodied in the Kennel Club's assured Breeder Scheme. It is strongly recommended that members who breed should apply to join the Scheme.
- 16 Any bitch shall be at least 18 months old on the day of birth of her first litter. There should be at least twelve months between the birth of her litters and she should have no more than three litters in total. No bitch shall be bred from over the age of seven years.

Breach of these provisions may result in expulsion from club membership, and/or disciplinary action by the Kennel Club and/or reporting to the relevant authorities for legal action, as appropriate.

'KC regulations require members of the SYWC to agree to the SYWC Code of Ethics - and to confirm agreement each year'. All applicants for membership must confirm their agreement by signing below.

INFORMATION FROM THE JUDGES

Colin Ashmore

I have been in dogs for over 48 years and judging for 40 years having successfully bred and shown Beagles making up a number of Champions. I no longer breed or show due to judging commitments both abroad and in the United Kingdom. I am passed to award CC's in 17 breeds, 15 in the Hound group, 1 in the Working and 1 in the Pastoral group, also being passed for the Hound Group at Championship show level, having also judged stakes classes at Championship show level and been privileged to have judged at the Festival of Hounds held at Peterborough in 2014, Drag hounds and Bloodhounds on the flags. I had the Honour of judging at the Breed Council Whippet of the Year Competition in 2005, my last appointment judging Whippets in the UK was in 2012. Having also judged three times at Crufts in 2007, 2012 and 2018, judging extensively abroad since 1998 and this year judging in the Czech Republic, South Africa and Finland where one of the breeds I am judging is Whippets, having judged them previously on two other occasions in other European countries.

I am very pleased to have the opportunity to judge at the South Yorkshire Whippet Club Championship show and I am looking forward to my day with the Whippet exhibitors and their dogs.

Having had the pleasure of showing whippets for 33 years I am delighted, privileged and very thankful to be invited by SYWC to fulfil my first championship judging appointment.

I was introduced to whippets and our wonderful hobby by my dear friend Mary Finkel. Mary and I are founder members of the North Eastern Whippet Society and it is an honour to be the current Chairperson of this innovative club. In 1985, aged 14, I made my show debut at Darlington Championship Show handling Mary's homebred bitch, Maluk Gay Lark. It was a day many whippet exhibitors can only dream of as I won the CC, BOB and the Hound Group...and that was the start of my life long obsession!

Together with my youngest son, Luke, I own the Danluke affix and have made many happy memories with our small kennel. From our beautiful foundation bitch Falconrag Rhumour we bred our first champion D' Dance of Love; RBIS winner at Border Union, and she produced our D' Lord of the Dance; top male whippet 2017 with 11 CCs to date. Also, at Danluke and campaigned to his title is champion Collooney Tricky Dicky, sire to my first homebred champion and behind much of our success; we will be forever grateful for this special boy and support from breeder Viv Coulter. To date, Luke and I have bred/owned 12 whippets with a stud book number.

It is fair to say we are truly blessed with both quality and quantity of whippets and I have heard so many 'all- rounder' judges state it is the most desired appointment to judge whippet bitches. I know my only frustration on the day will be not having enough green and white cards but I hope I do the breed proud and remember 'we all take the best dog home!'

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.30 a.m.
 2. Dogs will be received until 12 noon after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
 3. Judging will commence at 9.00 am.
 4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their Judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all Judging has been completed.
 5. ENTRY FEES: Members: £12.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog
Non-Members: £14.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Not for Competition £3.00 per dog. Catalogues: £4.00 pre-paid with entries. Membership: Single or Joint £10.00; Overseas £12.00.
 6. Prize Money: 1st - £5.00; 2nd - £3.00; 3rd - 2.00; Reserve - £1.00.
 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
 10. **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and received a first prize in a class at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
 11. **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
 16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
- WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLY ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue

or within the precincts of the show.

18. **Not for Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for competition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act of omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
21. Entry fees will not be refunded once an entry has been made.
22. The use of Video Cameras during the Judging is not allowed.
23. Mobile Phones must be switched off or set to 'Silent' mode when in the vicinity of the Judging Ring.
24. Passes will not be sent out. Please enclose a stamped addressed envelope when sending your entries if confirmation is required.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday 3rd September 2018**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) **Withdrawal**
The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
- (2) **Transfer**
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
