CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) Members shall maintain the best possible standards of health and environment for their dogs, not keeping more than they can properly care for.
- 2) Stud Dogs and Brood Bitches shall be in good health and condition, and ideally free from hereditary defects.
Due consideration should be given to type and temperament before breeding a litter. Members shall strive to eradicate hereditary defects from the breed.
- 3) Bitches under the age of 15 months and over the age of 8 years shall not be used for breeding, and neither shall a bitch be bred from more than twice out of three successive seasons.
- 4) Every care shall be taken when selling puppies or older dogs, at home or abroad, ensuring that no stock is sold to laboratories, pet shops or dealers. Breeders shall also help with the re-homing of a dog, sold by them, should this become necessary.
- 5) Members are required to maintain and pass on to buyers of stock, accurate records of health, pedigree and registration documentation, as well as advice on feeding, rearing and general care for the dog.
- 6) Members will only use 'Social Media' for the promotion of the breed, and not for the selling of puppies and older stock.
- 7) Members must accept that, like people, dogs grow old and need special care and attention. They must therefore be prepared to love and care for a dog, for all its life whilst in their ownership.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday 5th March 2022**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) **WITHDRAWAL**

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19.

(2) **TRANSFER**

(a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**YEARLING:** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN:** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

**SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES:** To be judged separate from the main show classes. Dogs must be previously entered in the main show before being entered into a SAC. Wins will not qualify to any awards gained in the main show classes. There will be no special award issued. (IE: Best of ....). SAC are being scheduled to assist novice judges with hands-on experience.

### Jacky Cutler (Lankeela)

At fifteen I worked at the local track parading greyhounds, when a friend and I bought a puppy who won a couple of races. My first venture into showing was an exemption show where he won Best Puppy! I then bought a GSD puppy to accompany me to the isolated stables where I kept my horse and we took up obedience followed by agility, which was in its infancy then. After moving to Norfolk a second GSD followed who was from show breeding, and as he was already entered I took him to the Suffolk Show where he won two classes and Best of Breed! I added a Border Collie and then after a four year wait a Smooth Collie in 1989. A Lancashire Heeler puppy followed and I have now just got five Heelers. Apart from my Smooth Collie I fostered a male Rough for Collie Rescue. I have also handled several dogs of both breeds, including taking a second and third CC with a friend's Smooth.

I first judged GSDs in 1993 followed by Heelers in 1995 and Smooth Collies in 2003, then Roughs in 2009. I award CCs in Lancashire Heelers and have judged in Finland, Sweden and Norway and have judged the Pastoral Group many times. I am on the A2 List for Border Collies and I am awaiting the outcome of a Grandfathering application for German Shepherd Dogs. I have attended several breed seminars on Smooth Collies and a combined one on both varieties and have passed both the hands on and MCE held by the Smooth Collie Club of GB. I have also stewarded at breed club shows

On the admin side I am a Show Secretary/Manager for three general societies and also three breed clubs, Lancashire Heelers, Estrela Mountain dogs and Shetland Sheepdogs. I am also a Breed Education Co-ordinator, KCLC Breeds Council Rep, Breed Health Coordinator and I am on the PBHF Committee.

I look forward to judging your dogs at the East Anglian Collie Association.

### Gill Whitaker (Siluto)

I have owned dogs for most of my life, previously having owned and bred Yorkshire Terriers. My husband Nigel and I have proudly owned Rough Collies since 1999 when we obtained our first tricolour rescue, a lovely girl with a wonderful personality, and from then we have been hooked on the breed.

We currently own six rough collie bitches in all three colours which we have been showing since 2008, enjoying some modest success at both open and championship shows. We have grown our "pack" through breeding and acquisition, all living in the home and giving us great fun and comfort (most of the time!). During this period I have been very grateful for the guidance and encouragement received from fellow exhibitors.

I bred my first litter in 2010 and then in 2012 bought another tricolour bitch. She did reasonably well and earned her Veteran Warrant in 2020. In 2014 we bought our first blue merle bitch who I've had a lot of fun with and she did very well in her first show as a puppy and again in her first show as a veteran in April 2021, coincidentally at EACA. We had a lovely litter from her in 2018 from which we kept two bitch puppies. All my girls have made me proud to have consistently qualified each year for Crufts, at least until Covid came along!

I have been a member of our local ringcraft club for the last 13 years, including serving on the committee and have helped out with training and showing classes when required.

I am grateful to the East Anglian Collie Association for inviting me to judge the Special Award classes in Spring 2022. I look forward to the opportunity immensely.

## RULES and REGULATIONS

- The Show will open at 11.00am.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 11.30am with the Rough Dogs and Smooth Collies. Judging of the 3 Special Award classes will take place during the lunch break, and the judging of the Rough Bitches will commence after lunch.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed.
- Entry Fees:**  
**MEMBERS - ROUGHS/SMOOTHS:** £5.00 per dog first class, subsequent entries same dog £2.50.  
**SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES:** £2.00 per dog.  
**NON MEMBERS - ROUGHS/SMOOTHS:** £7.00 per dog first class, sub. entries same dog £2.50.  
**NOT FOR COMPETITION:** £2.00 per dog.  
**CATALOGUE:** £3.00 with entry. Pre-paid Catalogues must be collected by 1.00pm or they will be made available to other exhibitors.  
**ROSETTE DONATION:** £2.50 per class.  
**ADVERTISEMENTS:** £6.00 full page, £4.00 half page.  
**MEMBERSHIP FEES:** £6.00 Joint, £4.00 Single (1st January – 31st December). Exhibitors applying for first time membership must complete an application form. All members are expected to abide by our Code of Ethics that can be found on the reverse of this Schedule.
- There is no prize money on offer at this show.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition, unless entered in the Puppy Stakes class.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- Best Puppy in Show.**  
 Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy). A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.
- Best in Show.**  
 The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from Best of Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy). Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without and Authority to Compete numbers will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.  
 Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.  
**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
- Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
  - Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
  - No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
  - The Committee of the E.A.C.A. does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to persons, dogs or property whilst entering or leaving the Venue. Upon this understanding only are Entries received.
  - Parents will be responsible for the behaviour of their children within the precincts of our Show and Events.
  - If acknowledgement of entries is required a stamped self addressed postcard should be enclosed with entries for the Secretary's signature.
  - Should any question arise not provided for in these rules, the Committee's decision is final, subject to appeal to The Kennel Club.
  - No person whilst an undischarged bankrupt may serve on the Committee of, or hold any other Office or Appointment within a Kennel Club registered Society.
- TRADE STANDS.** The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- EXERCISE AREA.** Please respect the venue and use the Exercise Areas provided. Exhibitors/Owners are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge and to keep all dogs on leads whilst exercising.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
  - Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
 Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.



### WELFARE OF DOGS

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

Your address will appear in the catalogue. Tick to object to publication. See our Privacy Notice for more information. The Privacy Notice sets out how we keep your data safely and compliantly

### DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and **AT RISK** if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

### ADDRESS WITHHELD FOR PUBLICATION

Please note the points below:

1. Tick the box near your name and address on the front of the entry form if you do **NOT** want your **ADDRESS** to appear in the catalogue. Your name will still be printed above your dog records as normal.
2. Your address is still needed for the sending out of schedules and exhibitors passes. So you must still enter your address in the normal way.
