Should it be necessary for the hall to be evacuated, please remember that evacuation should be carried out as speedily but as safely as possible, as in the case of a fire. It is important that you do not block the exit routes with cages or bags and follow any instructions given to you by the Show Manager/Club Management regarding evacuation procedures.

IMPORTANCE OF CHECKING ELIGIBILITY BEFORE ENTERING A SHOW

Following a series of recent disqualifications from awards, which are disappointing for everyone concerned, the Kennel Club would like to remind exhibitors of the importance of checking their dog's eligibility for classes before submitting an entry for a show.

The Kennel Club would particularly like to draw the attention of exhibitors to the importance of understanding that overseas awards which count towards an overseas Champion title (CAC, CACIB, Green Star etc) are the equivalent of a CC in the UK. Likewise, Reserve CACs etc are the equivalent of a Reserve CC. These awards should be taken into account when looking at eligibility and entering shows in the UK.

If in doubt, please contact the Kennel Club for advice or enter the dog in the open class which, by definition, is open to all.

About the Judge David Hunt (Ottaswell)

I feel very honoured to be asked to judge the forthcoming Southern BTC CH show on such a special day as the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebration day and I am certain that the show will be organised in a way that reflects the occasion.

Growing up there was always a dog in the house. When Gill and I got married we moved in with her widowed father. He and Gill had bred English Rough Collies and Shetland Sheepdogs to the highest standard using many well-known bloodlines. There was also a terrier about the place. Some years later when our children had arrived and the last of father-in-law's dogs had passed away, we resolved to have no more dogs. However I arrived home some weeks later to be told Gill had booked a long legged Jack Russell terrier from a local friend. The dog arrived and we were encouraged to show her at local Working Terrier shows. We were hooked and, some years later, having bred a few litters were doing well at working shows including winning B.I.S at several, one of which was judged by Bill Gillott of the Midland BTC. One of our dogs was used to promote the Parson Russell Terrier for KC Recognition (the picture of 'Just Barney' was on the front page of Dog World) and included in the PRT book by Jean and Frank Jackson (Clipstone). I also award CC's in PRT's.

I had always enjoyed seeing the BTs at working shows and as we were leaving for home one day we were told that a terrier man was selling all his BTs on his wife's instructions. We came away with a nice small 10-month-old bitch called Ria and promised KC papers, which duly arrived – all for £50. The bitch (Red Hot Ria at Ryswick) became the foundation bitch of our small kennel and the terrier man was Andrew Willis, a well-known and successful BT exhibitor under the Ryswick affix. We began showing at KC Open shows and having been advised by Andrew to use a Jack Price stud dog, we bred our first litter by Oxcroft Rocky. We were delighted to qualify a puppy (Midnight Wisdom) for Crufts at our first CH show attempt – SCCA under judge Pam Creed coming third of three – he later went on to win a RCC. We then registered our affix - Ottaswell.

Over the past 30+ years we have travelled the country exhibiting at all the current CH show venues at least once except for Blackpool. We have made up three Champions – Ottaswell Superstition (2001), Ethlencoral Pip of Ottaswell (2012) and finally Ottaswell Palamedes (2015), along with several others winning RCC's. Puppies we have sold have also won CC's and RCC's. These days we are taking life at a more leisurely pace.

I began judging in the early 90's and awarded my first set of CC's at Birmingham National in 2005. This will be my 8th appointment. I have also had the pleasure of enjoying European hospitality whilst judging in Denmark, Finland and the Republic of Ireland. When judging I have had the opportunity to go over some outstanding dogs that make you stand back and really take notice. We have also made many good friends along the way.

I have been a member of the Southern BTC committee for over 30 years and currently serve as the Vice-Chairman. During that time I have attended most of the shows and many of the other events that they have organised. For about 12 years I organised the Discover Dogs stand at Earls Court and have been the CH show manager since 2009. I am looking forward to judging some of the younger dogs born during the pandemic and meeting up with old friends.

The Club is pleased to announce that we will be live streaming portions of the show to our Facebook page and Website.

This will include the challenges for Best Dog, Best Bitch, Best in Show and Best Puppy.

SPECIAL NOTES

- Exhibitors are reminded that puppies under 4 months of age are not allowed within the precincts of the show.
- Please clean up any mess promptly as required by the Kennel Club and ensure children and dogs are kept under control at all times.
- 3. In accordance with Kennel Club guidelines, Exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

Definitions of Classes

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of Postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday 9th May 2022**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawa
- The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19.
- (2) Transfe.
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. **JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

- **NOVICE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
- POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- **LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- **OPEN:** For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
- VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years and over on the first day of the Show.
- **SPECIAL OPEN WORKING:** For dogs holding Working Certificates issued by the Southern Border Terrier Club **only**. Please give number on entry form.
- NOT FOR COMPETITION: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society. Dogs of 4 months of age may be entered NFC. Please give full details on entry form.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Opening of Show: The Show will open at 9.30 am.
- Arrival of Dogs: Dogs will be received until 12 noon, after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
- Judging Time: Judging will commence at 10.00 am and exhibitors will be responsible for their dogs being on time for judging.
- Removal of Dogs: Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- Entry Fees: Members: First entry £12.00 per dog; Non Members: First entry £14.00 per dog; All subsequent
 entries with the same dog and dogs entered NFC £2.00. Entries can be made online at www.highampress.co.uk
- Prize Money: BIS £25.00; BOS £10.00; BPIS £10.00; 1st £5.00; 2nd £4.00; 3rd £3.00; Res £2.00; VHC £1.00.
- 7. Refusal of Entries: The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies: Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show (if scheduled). Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11. Best in Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move.</u> This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - · Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - · When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty
 of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. **Not for Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
 - **Regulation F.1.c:** Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at all Kennel Club licensed shows. Furthermore, dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Match competitions.
- Modifications: No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. Dog Fouling: Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- 21. Entries: Entries to be made online at www.highampress.co.uk (Online entries close: 12 noon on 17th May 2022). All dogs must be registered or transferred at the Kennel Club before the Show. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Limited Rules and Show Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
- 22. All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot accept or dispatch unaccompanied dogs.
- 23. Exclusion of Dogs: The Committee are empowered to exclude or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition either from disease, vice, natural or other causes and if such exclusion takes place, either before or after the dog is judged, the entry fee will be forfeited.
- 24. Judges: Should the judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the Executive Committee reserve the right of appointing another judge to fulfil his/her duties. The judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the prize(s) in any class if in his/her opinion the dog(s) exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. The judge is not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in this Schedule of prizes, and such awards shall not have any value or count as a win except with the consent of the Secretary, first obtained in writing.
- 25. All Rules and Regulations or Definitions and Instructions of the nature of rules and regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule, shall be deemed to be the Regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these Regulations.

- 27. Regulations F F9 Exhibition of Dogs:
 - a) No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
 - b) The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
- (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's
 coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any
 external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.

- 4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the show secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
