
#### **Directions to the Venue**

If a competitor, or anyone in their household, has Covid-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid-19 they must isolate in line with Government advice. The competitor must not attend the event.

All judges at this show agree to abide by the following statement: "In assessing dogs, judges must penalise any features or exaggerations which they consider would be detrimental to the soundness, health and well-being of

- 23. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to The Kennel Club.
- 24. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

25. Welfare of Dogs

A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any obedience show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.

26. Food and/or toys shall not be carried or given to a dog under test except in Introductory Class where silent toy and food rewards may be used between and after exercises and in a special class if specified in the class definition. Competitors must not distract other dogs when rewarding their dog with food, toy or play. (Refer to Obedience Code of Conduct).

#### **OBEDIENCE DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES**

- 1. Dogs are ineligible to compete at limited shows which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Obedience Champions are only eligible to compete in Class C at open and championship Shows.
- 2. A dog must be entered in the lowest scheduled class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired plus one additional class at the society's discretion.

Exemptions from this regulation are:-

A dog entered in a Good Citizen Dog Scheme Special Pre-Beginner Obedience Stakes Class or

A dog entered into a Young Kennel Club (YKC) obedience class which may also be entered in a maximum of two other scheduled classes (including YKC classes) for which it is eligible or

A dog only entered in a special class (or classes) provided such a class (or classes) are defined in the schedule. Such entries must be made in line with the show's closing date for entries.

PRE-BEGINNERS To compete in pre-beginners a handler or dog must not have won two 1st prizes in either

pre-beginners or beginners nor gained a 3rd place or above in any other obedience class. (Introductory class excepted.) and have not elected to progress on points from Pre-Beginners.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won two 1st prizes in obedience classes. (Introductory class,

pre-beginners and beginners excepted) and where the handler has not elected to progress on

points from Novice.

**CLASS A** For dogs which have not won three 1st prizes in class A. B and open class C in total and where

the handler has not elected to progress on points from Class A.

Progression on wins. Progression from each class will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in Regulations G(A). To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Open, Premier or Championship Obedience shows. A first place will count towards progression.

Progression on points. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to the next class, up to and including into Open Class C by gaining points at each level, using the Obedience Excellent scale of points scheme as follows:

- · Ten points for first prize
- Four points for second prize
- · Two points for third prize
- · One point for fourth prize

If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary/chief steward signs the dog's Obedience Record Book at the first show entered in the higher class. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog or handler has progressed, they cannot return to the class that they had progressed from. All wins and places to fourth since 1 January 2019 can be included when calculating points. Points are specific to a particular class and cannot be used against a lower or higher class.

Points required for progression on points are as follows:

- 1. 20 points required for progression from Pre-Beginners.
- 2. 20 points required for progression from Beginners.
- 3. 20 points required for progression from Novice.
- 4. 30 points required for progression from Class A.
- 5. 30 points required for progression from Class B.

#### **OBEDIENCE RULES AND REGULATIONS**

These rules and regulations are to be read in conjunction with The Kennel Club Obedience Show Regulations G under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with The Kennel Club G Regulations, available from The Kennel Club.

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed obedience shows must be registered at The Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 3. Only dogs of 6 calendar months of age and over are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed obedience shows.
- 4. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
- 5. Entry is limited to Shetland Sheepdogs.
- 6. There is no capping of entries at this show.
- Dogs which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club are not eligible for entry at this show.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
- 9. Running orders will be available on the day.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 11. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition i.e Tuesday 20th September 2022 shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next class at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary or the show processor at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es). The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower class. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next class the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 12. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
- 13. In classes without a full running order dogs will be received until one hour after the commencement of judging (10.30am) after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the show management.
- 14. For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
- 15. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
- 16. The dog should be led into the ring for judging with a smooth collar or, half-check collar, with lead attached (unless otherwise directed) and should be at the handler's side.
- 17. Animals allowed in Event
  - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the provisor that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 18. Following discussion between the chief steward and the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the show if it is:
  - a. A bitch which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal. e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
  - The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the show Incident Book and submitted to The Kennel Club
- Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 20. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
- 21. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 22. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.

#### **Judges Profiles**

#### **Marion Withers**

My family had our first pet Sheltie in 1962, and when she died, a friend in Clumber Spaniels suggested we start showing and breeding them. It did not take much persuasion! The Stanydale affix was registered with the Kennel Club in 1979, in joint ownership with my late mother, and our foundation Shetland Sheepdog bitch from which all current Stanydales come down was Loughrigg Tarantella, bred by the late Audrey Britten. Our first champion, Ch Stanydale Challenger, was made up in 2002. I have continued the breeding line since my mother passed away, and my latest home bred champion, a tricolour dog, Ch Stanydale Shot In The Dark JW, is a direct descendent of Challenger.

My first judging appointment was in 1984 and since then I have judged breed and variety classes at open shows, mainly in the Pastoral, Working and Utility groups. I first awarded CCs in Shelties in the UK in 2001, and since then have also officiated at championship level in Europe, Australia and New Zealand. In 2018 I had the honour of judging Sheltie dogs at Crufts. I am also approved to award CCs in Lhasa Apsos.

I served on the committee of Colchester Canine Society for over 20 years, also as secretary of the East Anglian Branch of the English Shetland Sheepdog Club (ESSC). I have been on the main committee of the ESSC since 1997, initially as Treasurer, then as Vice Chairman, and since 2019 as Chairman. I am a lecturer and assessor on the Club's Training of Judges Scheme, and on the mentor and observer lists for the new Kennel Club Judges Education Programme.

I have a keen interest in health matters, and am the UK Kennel Club Breed Health Coordinator for Shetland Sheepdogs, as well as Treasurer of the Pastoral Breeds Health Foundation, which promotes health testing and research into inherited conditions of breeds in the Pastoral Group. I have been closely involved with the research into PRA in Shelties which has resulted in the development of a DNA test for BBS2-PRA.

This will be my second time judging the dog entry at the ESSC championship show and I am very much looking forward to the appointment.

#### Marion ten Cate (Own Delight Shelties)

I grew up with dogs. My parents got their first Sheltie in 1964. In 1970 we bought three Shelties from Exford, Hildlane and Shelert lines and an American Cocker Spaniel. That was our introduction to the Dog World. Showing and training became a hobby and part of life for the family. I started training and showing dogs when I was 13 years old. In 1976 I became Dutch Obedience Champion with my Cocker Spaniel

Our kennel name is 'Own Delight'. The first Sheltie litter was born in 1975. We only bred a litter when we had the intention to keep a dog. All dogs live in the house and they are part of the family. That is why we have now, 45 years later, bred only six generations. Every generation gave us a Show Champion and we bred four following generation Show Champions. We have owned and bred 16 Sheltie Champions in all colours. My pride and joy was my dog Ch. Own Delight's Pascal who was a dual champion. I handled him to a Show Champion and in 2006 he became an Agility Champion at the age of nine years. I still have two Show Champion daughters from him, with which I still train agility.

I studied Biology and specialized in animal (dog) genetics. My first judge's assessment in Holland was in 1996 for Shelties. In 2001 I passed the judges training scheme of the ESSC. So now I am on the UK A1 list as a Breed Specialist in Shelties and on the A1 list for Belgian Shepherds.

I have an interest in everything that has to do with dogs. So, I judge now FCI Group 1 and FCI Group 5, which is similar to the Pastoral and Utility Groups in the UK and some breeds in other Groups.

I have judged in many countries including Australia and South-Africa and I have judged more than 300 CACIB/CAC shows, with in total over 30,000 dogs including 4,200 Shelties and 5,000 Belgian Shepherds.

Next to being a judge I am involved in several committees and I give seminars about Breed Standards, Construction and Genetics of dogs. So, dogs are not only a hobby but also a way of life. I love it.

#### **DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES**

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Wednesday 7th September 2022.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
  - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.
- (2) Transfer
  - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CAC/B/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**TYRO:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

**LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN:** For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.

SPECIAL OPEN: As for Open but with restrictions shown.

BREEDERS: For dogs bred by the exhibitor.

SPECIAL OPEN WORKING: For dogs that work in any of the disciplines covered by The Working Section of the E.S.C.C.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS: Owner, Handler and dog not to have won a CC, Reserve CC or Junior Warrant in the breed.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Dogs entered NFC must be four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Only Shetland Sheepdogs may be entered NFC at this show.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
- 19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. The entry fee of a dog entered but not sent to the Show will be forfeited.
- 21. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his engagement the Committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing another in his place.
- Members whose subscriptions for the current year have not been paid are not eligible to compete for Specials or Trophies confined to members of the Club.
- 23. The Club shall not be liable for any injury, loss or damage occasioned to any property of the exhibitor, his servants or agents in the said venue during the period commencing when the exhibitor starts preparing his said space to the time when the exhibitor has finally removed from the venue all his property used in connection with the Show and whether such injury, loss or damage be occasioned by the act or negligence of the Club or its servants or agents or by other persons. The exhibitor shall be responsible for and shall fully indemnify and hold harmless the Club against all claims, actions, suits and proceedings and all costs and expenses arising in any way in connection with the occupation by the exhibitor of any space at the Show or in any way in connection with any person whatsoever entering or approaching or being near to such space. Such indemnity shall extend to any injury (including death), loss or damage whatsoever and howsoever occasioned (including any occasioned by the negligence of the Club, its servants or agents) or whether occasioned by the exhibitor, his servants or agents or any other person or whether contributed to by the exhibitor, his servants or agents or not.
- 24. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 25. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 26. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge (this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency); b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
- Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

**EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:** In accordance with Kennel Club guidelines, Exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

# The Kennel Club Building: Stoneleigh Park's Dog Exercise Policy

The Kennel Club Building is on Stoneleigh Park Showground, which is owned by the Royal Agricultural Society England (RASE). As such, all visitors to the Kennel Club Building must abide by RASE's policies on exercising dogs. This policy states that dogs must be on a lead at all times, except if in the designated Stoneleigh Park Dog Exercise Ring (block 62, Avenue D, 10th Street) or the Kennel Club Building's gated outside rings.

Organisers of events using the Kennel Club Building are asked to note that, unless using the Stoneleigh Park Dog Exercise Ring, they must alert exhibitors and visitors to stay in the areas surrounding the Kennel Club Building, as the rest of the Showground is private property.

- 1. The Show will open at 8.30 am.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 9.30am (Bitches), 10.00am (Dogs), 9.30am (Obedience).
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all Judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fees: Members: first breed entry £12.00 per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Non Members: first breed entry £16.00 per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Not For Competition £1.00. Junior Handling: £2.00 per class. Special Beginners Stakes: £4.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 subsequent entry with the same dog. Obedience: first obedience entry £4.00 per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Have a Go Rally: £2.00 per dog (pay on the day) Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries; £3.50 on the day. Entries can be made online at <a href="https://www.highampress.co.uk">www.highampress.co.uk</a>.

- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show (if scheduled). Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- 11. Best in Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move.</u> This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - · If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - · Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty
    of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
  - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
- (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's
  coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any
  external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
  - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
  - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
  - Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
- 4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the show secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
